

BUTLER COUNTY ORDINANCE IV-6

An Ordinance prohibiting excessive soil loss from private lands to County Right of Way ditches.

1. No person shall allow excessive soil loss from private lands to county road ditches.
2. Definitions:
 - A. Excessive soil loss: that erosions that is above the established tolerable level of soil loss which occurs in greater amounts than the normal amount expected given the weather conditions.
 - B. Establish Tolerable Levels of Soil Loss: The allowable level of soil loss as defined for the particular soil type by the Butler County Soil and Water Conservation Districts.

3. Remedy:

If in the opinion of the County Board of Supervisors, excessive soil loss from private land has caused drainage problems in the public road right of Way at the option of the Board of Supervisors they may order 1 of 2 remedies.

- A. The Secondary Road crew to clean out the ditch and the property owner to file and implement a soil loss prevention plan.
- B. In event the property owner does not file and implement a soil loss prevention plan, the Board shall order the Secondary Road crew to clean out the ditch and assess the cost against the property owner to be collected on his taxes.

4. Effective Date:


This Ordinance shall become effective on 1-21-91
